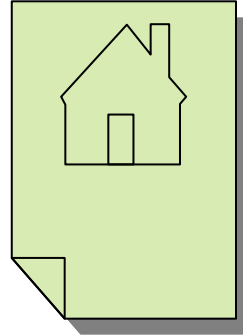


AFFORDABLE HOUSING

We are progressing to planning at both Lafrowda Close, St Just and Moorland Close in Pendeen. Once final drawings are available I will put them on our website and lodge them at St Just Town Council offices so they can be viewed. Hopefully this will be before Christmas or possibly early in the New Year. At Moorland Close, the draft plans provide 2 terraces of three affordable homes (6 in total). There will also be two bungalows sold at open market or near open market prices to help fund the affordable homes. At Lafrowda Close the draft plans provide a pair of semi-detached houses plus a bungalow.

We have had a loan approved to get the project to planning so we are just finalising the documentation so we can access the funds.

Once plans are approved we will be keen to identify purchasers so we are moving our allocations policy towards approval of the Board. This has to tie in closely with the policy of Cornwall Council and will give priority to those with a tie closest and for longest to the locations of the homes. If you are not already on Cornwall Council's Home Choices



register then do apply and pass the news on to others you know who may be in need of housing in St Just or Pendeen. Once the allocation policy is finalised I will place this on the website and at the Town Council offices for viewing. This will be early in January.

Donations or interest free loans would still be welcome to keep our costs down.

Sanctuary Housing

Some may be wondering about the signs at Gew Farm. This is not a CLT project but I understand that Sanctuary Housing, a national housing association is looking to develop 30 socially rented homes. There is a possibility they will consider selling some, as affordable but their priority is rented homes. There is a consultation event planned, I believe for 8 December.

Thanks to the enthusiasm of one of our newest volunteers, Jenny, our produce is not only to be seen at the Pendeen Farmer's Market but more recently at St Just Primary School. Mrs O'Brien has kindly agreed to us sharing a stall with the school selling our farm produce and produce the school and parents have grown. A great partnership and boost to both our funds. This will be advertised and in the New Year we plan for it to be a regular fortnightly event. On a more practical level....the turkeys are doing what turkeys do best.....getting fat! The chickens are about to be moved to their new site...on the other side of the field! Sadly, the pigs are gone. Sad because they are great animals to have around and we plan to have more...in fact anyone interested in a future share should let us know. All our hay is now sold. The visiting cattle, that have managed our outer fields beautifully, are about to go home for the winter months.

Great news also on the veg growing front as the farm crew have recently erected our new polytunnel. Funding came from a Cornwall Neighbourhoods 4 Change 'pot' along with match funding from BCF business and in-kind labour...so a huge thanks to all our volunteers for their efforts, which were literally doubled in

value!! Thanks as well to CN4C for the cash donation. As far as planning for the future, we have now submitted our final application for a lottery bid that, if successful, will make the dream of owning our community farm a reality. A plan B is always a good idea so the BCF finance team is working on a share issue, mortgage possibilities and potential lending schemes appropriate to a community project.

We would also like to announce and welcome a new member to the team, Jackie Packer, who has kindly offered to help with our bookkeeping and banking (phew!). It's a great relief to have someone with such experience (and patience) to guide us and keep us in check. I'm sure there are lots of things we have missed but you can always come and visit and see for yourself how your community farm is progressing, to buy some eggs or volunteer. Volunteer open sessions remain 1-5pm on a Tuesday and Saturday and 10-3pm on a Thursday.



Finally the fun-d raising team have been working hard on the winter celebration at the farm and the date for your diary is 22nd December between 3 and 6pm. As usual there will be a number of great activities for all the family, some festive food and a chance to gather together for a seasonal sing-song round the Christmas tree...so look out for posters in St Just nearer the day and bring your friends and family. We are also inviting the members from Age Concern, at around 5pm, for a few carols and mince pies in the warmth of the farm kitchen...so please encourage your gran or grandad to come along whether they attend Age Concern or not. Once again many thanks to all who have helped and supported us throughout the year and we would like to wish you all a very Merry Christmas, Winter Solstice and a Happy New Year.
