## DO YOU KNOW YOUR CORRECT POSTAL ADDRESS?

## IS THIS ROAD THAT YOU LIVE IN CAPE CORNWALL <u>ROAD</u>, OR CAPE CORNWALL <u>STREET</u>?

## PLEASE DO NOT THROW THIS LETTER AWAY UNTIL YOU HAVE READ IT, AS IT COULD DIRECTLY AFFECT YOU.

We live in what <u>we</u> have always assumed to be Cape Cornwall ROAD, but which the Local Authority (what used to be Penwith District Council, is now Cornwall Council) and the Royal Mail refer to as Cape Cornwall STREET. (Please note that this is <u>not</u> the section from Bank Square to the West Place/Chapel Road crossroads.) The confusion has caused mail to be wrongly delivered, and visitors and delivery drivers have been unable to find our address.

FACT 1: Mailing databases show Cape Cornwall STREET, but maps and mapping websites show Cape Cornwall ROAD.

**FACT 2:** The Ordnance Survey (OS) shows this highway as Cape Cornwall ROAD, westwards from the crossroads of West Place and Chapel Road near the Junior School, all the way to the National Trust car park above Priest's Cove. According to the OS, Cape Cornwall STREET is only the short bit between Bank Square and the West Place/Chapel Road cross-roads, where it becomes Cape Cornwall ROAD.

**FACT 3:** The local town map situated in Bank Square shows it quite clearly as Cape Cornwall ROAD, in agreement with local knowledge, as well as with the OS.

- **FACT 4**: The Local Authority doesn't recognise the name of Cape Cornwall ROAD at all. According to them, Cape Cornwall STREET runs from Bank Square in the middle of St Just westwards to the road junction outside the Cricket Club. They have even admitted that there is confusion with their own records.
- **FACT 5**: Royal Mail apparently gets its information from the Local Authority. They also refer to this road as Cape Cornwall STREET, and will not change anything until and unless they get authorisation from the Local Authority.

**HEALTH & SAFETY** could be compromised – lives could be put at risk if emergency services fail to find a location within an acceptable time because of conflicting information.

**To remove this confusion**, we are campaigning to have the name of this road corrected to Cape Cornwall ROAD, so that it matches with what it is known as locally, and with what it is called on the OS and local town maps. In order for this to succeed, we need to send the signed agreement of everyone living along Cape Cornwall ROAD to the Local Authority. I am prepared to see this through, but only with your co-operation.
