### Why designate West Cornwall a Dark Sky Reserve?


The main purpose of a Dark Sky Reserve designation would be to protect the amazing quality of the sky at night over West Cornwall.

## BEFORE WE DECIDE TO PROCEED WE WANT YOUR VIEWS.

As well as helping to protect the night sky from light pollution, the designation will provide a focus for awareness and learning about the stars and solar systems.

Darkness is good for our health; our body clocks haven't evolved for artificial lighting – and neither has wildlife.

A Dark Sky designation can be used to promote local tourism; elsewhere there have been tangible benefits from this. Most people love a starry sky – lots of people study it closely, many more of us just enjoy gazing at it.
